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Who would buy this? - Someone who likes the style this artist puts forward or if you have good knowldge of anatomy and are well versed with drawing clean shapes and doing clean drawings.

Who should not buy this? - Someone who thinks after watching this video he will be able to immitate the painting that the artist\/product displays on the store page. If you aren't good at drawing this won't help even with the painting stuff - which is exactly what this video is.

There is no hand holding.

There is no way to rate this video besides yes or no - so no it is.

What you getting here is 50 minutes of video about the technique the artist uses himself to paint quick drawings.

The artist himself is great at what he does but like he mentioned - its practice that will finally make the difference and that is where you have to decide if you want to pay \$5 for 50 minutes worth of practical and good advice as oppose to going to youtube and finding information over there. Practice needs realtime you not going to improve overnight.

If anything you will find which direction to go forth with this video, on the artist's website I believe this is listed as level iii advance for photoshop.

Money is non-refundable for obvious reasons - if you know the artist and want to support him go forth otherwise wait for prices to drop.

. JISEI was one of the first visual novels I ever played, and it has remained as one of the most interesting ones for me that I keep going back to. Although the first entry to the series is relatively short - more like a prologue to a much bigger story - it still has a lot of intrigue to entice you into sticking around to see what unfolds in future games.

You play as an unnamed male main character who is in the wrong place at the wrong time, and immediately thrown under suspicion in a murder investigation at a cafe. A local off duty detective giving you permission to ask some (mostly) harmless questions to help piece together what happened may seem unrealistic to some in this game, but rest assured, future installments explain why this detective in particular was so willing to trust a teenager unwilling to give up his real name.

Although the mystery in this visual novel is technically revolving around a murder, the *real mystery is who you're playing, why he* has this ability, and who the mysterious voice is that appears in his head and how they know what's happening inside the locked down cafe. Unfortunately, you'll only get some of the answers by the end, because some questions are linked to a much bigger picture that unfolds throughout the series. Each game gives you another piece of the puzzle, but it's never frustrating because each revelation feels like something huge and exciting.

Because of this, I'd really recommend purchasing all three games that are currently released so you can immediately move on to the next game when you finish this one. It's also extremely important to replay the game to get all of the endings, because this will unlock each of the games' epilogues which are part of the true ending. Playing all three games also gives you a better idea of the developing relationship between each of these characters, as the series really gives you a "found family" kind of vibe, as the murder investigation in this game brings together a team of misfits that will work together on solving future mysteries that are in some way related to their mysterious pasts.

As for JISEI itself, the game on its own is definitely worth buying to check out. The game gives you a bit of nonlinear freedom, as you can choose who you want to talk to and when, as well as getting to choose to examine the room that you're in to learn more about what's going on. This was a huge selling point for me when I first played, because it reminded me a bit of the point-and-click

mystery games I played as a kid. In this game, clicking examine will just give you a narration of what your MC observes for you, but in future installments this feature is upgraded to the player having to click around on various items in the room before you can learn more about them.

You may also recognize the art style as being the same as the Flower Shop series (Summer in Fairbrook, Winter in Fairbrook) as well as C14 Dating and the free visual novel Autumn's Journey. Deji's art is particularly lovely in this game, though, with Li Mei and Gurski's designs remaining my favourite.

You may also recognize the voice of Li Mei, who is voiced by Cherami Leigh. This was one of the first things I noticed, because I recognized her as the same person who did the voice of Mai in the Ghost Hunt anime dub, which is another series I have a soft spot for. All of the voicing in this game is fantastic though, and really brings the characters to life with the added depth and emotion. If you're the type to turn off the voice acting, I don't think that'll be an issue here - but if for some reason one of the characters has a voice you just don't want to listen to, you can turn it off for them individually and still enjoy listening to the rest.

All in all, I couldn't recommend this game enough, and I was very excited to see it had finally gotten released on STEAM. I've played and replayed this game several times, and I always enjoy it as much as the first time (though it helps if you wait a few months and forget some of the big reveals like I did). The team is also working on the fourth installment, and with each game improving on the last, I personally can't wait to see what else is in store.

Any complaints I've seen about it in reviews are from people who clearly don't like Zelda style games.

It's a very charming well desgined top down action RPG similar to zelda, where you collect items, do dungeons full of puzzles, and explore a giant overworld map. The thing that makes this game unique is that you only use spells, so it's very interesting to see all the different types of spells you get to cast. There is a lot of content including lots of hidden collectables, and lots to explore, items to collect and upgrade. There is backtracking just like you would expect from any zelda style game; You backtrack and try to find areas you haven't been to before as you get newer items. My one complaint is that unlike Zelda, the map isn't very good, so you won't be able to rely on as much to find where you are; the game even jokes about this itself. (There is a great map that someone created in the guides though).

Overall it's quite good, and if you are at all a fan of legend of zelda, you will be a fan of this game. At nearly double the price of the more popular and more succesfull game Dead by Daylight, this game was doomed before launch. Should've started working on a new game instead of trying to revive this one because reviving a game that's dead before it was even released with an all time max player count of like 1k seems impossible to me. Will change the review if the planned rework of the entire game is actually good.. This game is probably not worth it, no matter what you are looking for.

It's an easy match-3 game that is from what I have seen literally impossible to lose (if you're too slow the girls just dress up again). It's very short, I played through it in 40 minutes and while I got it on sale reduced to 3,98 \u20ac I'd argue that it isn't even worth this price tag.

Also the developer has confirmed that there won't be an adult patch. Censorship in this game is quite ridiculous at times, when nipples plus areolae are hidden by something as small as a few hairs or a string.

All in all I can't really recommend this to anyone. Extreme loveless and more then bad port of an obviously not so bad mobile game, which was for sure financed by micro transactions.

Has bugs, Dev knows it, but seems he has abandoned game, it crashes often and is a kind of unplayable, except you want to play it for years to get even the cheapest upgrades ingame. Without that upgrades you have to play the same levels over and over and over again.

Dont buy, even not in sale!. Super Hydorah is an extremely well made game, from its visual design to its options, and its controller support (PS4 controllers work with no hassle!). It's clear that developers knew exactly what they wanted to do with this game, and how to make it properly. If you're looking for an extremely polished and optimized shmup then look no further.

However, while I understand that this is probably accurate to Gradius (which was the main inspiration for this game), and ultimately a matter of opinion, Super Hydorah is difficult to an extremely excessive degree. The developers seem to be aware of this, and have added a lower difficulty option which lets you survive two hits by default rather than having to find a shield to survive just one. However, using it feels more like i'm just allowed to cheat rather than actually fixing the problem.

Buy this game if you want an authentic 2D Shoot-Em-Up experience with a fresh coat of paint, but be warned that this game is immensely punishing and not for everyone.

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
